- SA-1** **Sexual Abuse Victim Treatment:** address by Jan Hindman discussing the social/emotional reactions and treatment of sexual abuse victims from a developmental perspective. She presents specific treatment approaches that can be used by therapists treating sexual abuse victims. Recommended for professional development.

- SA-3** **Be Aware, Be Safe:** This video for teens presents three scenarios: an attempted assault by a stranger, a date assault, and an incest situation. The stories illustrate possible situations in which sexual assault can occur, prevention measures and coping mechanisms. The film uses Asian actors, and a controlled English vocabulary. It should be understandable by people with limited English or English proficiency.

- SA-4** **It Happened to Me:** A video for 6-9 year old boys on sexual abuse prevention. It depicts five scenarios providing instructional use on identifying the problem, establishing safety rules, and eliminating fear, shame, and confusion surrounding sexual abuse.

- SA-6** **Come in from the Storm: The Necklace:** In this dramatization, a well-adjusted 12 year old girl is told by her best friend that her father is sexually abusing her. The film contrasts a healthy adult/child relationship with an inappropriate one. Children learn about the awful realities of abuse, and abused children are helped to compare their abuse with a more positive possibility. Abuse victims are helped to feel the need for help and to understand the reasons to seek it. Recommended for children over age 12 with an adult discussion leader.
