Strengthening Families Rhode Island (SFRI), launched in the spring of 2005, is one of the original Center for Study of Social Policy **Pilot State Projects**. With Implementation Funding provided by the United Way of RI, SFRI built on the collaboration established in support of the state's Early Childhood Comprehensive Systems plan - **Successful Start**.

The premise of SFRI is that we train, support and guide child care and family support providers in their work with the parents of young children. We prepare the provider to be a strong competent mentor and coach for parents and other family members around issues of child development, parenting roles and responsibilities, and discipline. It is about parent engagement and family involvement - facilitating positive supportive relationships between parents and providers.

Strengthening Families Rhode Island Initiative is managed by Prevent Child Abuse Rhode Island in collaboration with a community leadership team and is supported by a grants from the RI Children & Family Trust Fund.

Technical assistance is provided by the Center for the Study of Social Policy and The National Alliance of Children's Trust and Prevention Fund.
